Developing Evidence of Impact for a Supported Housing Project

Bridge House Project



Overview

Bridge House (BH) provides supported drug and alcohol-free homes for people in recovery from addiction. MLR were commissioned in summer 2016 to develop their evidence base and impact monitoring. This three month project focused on:

- Engaging with external stakeholders, to understand more about service gaps that Bridge House fills and ideas for improvement.
- > Case studies and interviews with service users.
- Building an 'evidence of impact' webpage & report that funders could be sign-posted to a repository for monitoring & evaluation evidence.

What we did

17 case studies were completed by service users in July and August, together with 16 one-to-one service user interviews and three staff interviews.

12 representatives of external agencies provided feedback – including representatives from the following organisations & projects: Action on Addiction; Addaction; Age Concern; Choose Life Project (The Prisoner Initiative); Excel Housing Solutions; Everton in the Community; New Start Homes; Oasis Recovery Communities; Shelter; Tom Harrison House; Windsor Clinic.

Outcomes & added value

Themes which appear time and again in service user and stakeholder conversations are:

- The value placed on the personalised care provided at Bridge House.
- Provision of a safe and secure environment.
- > Trust and honesty that develops in time, nurtured by staff and mentors.

- Greater understanding of need, via service user and external agency perspectives.
