

AWF 'HEALING BEYOND HATE' ONLINE RACE HATE SURVEY Activate Project Reporting Anthony Walker Foundation



Overview >>

An online survey of strategic partners was undertaken for Anthony Walker Foundation (AWF) between January and April 2023 - to understand what partner representatives think of race hate support services, gaps in provision and ways to improve the service / support offer.

What we did >>

There were two delivery stages to the 2023 survey work:

1. Online questionnaire design, launch and analysis
2. Report writing and sharing of resources on bespoke project 'microsite' – see screengrab >>

Building on a summer 2022 survey, in early 2023 strategic partners were encouraged by AWF managers, Trustees and service delivery staff to get involved in this exercise, with the online survey running for 13 weeks. Mental health and wellbeing were key threads in questioning.

16 questions were grouped under 3 main parts:

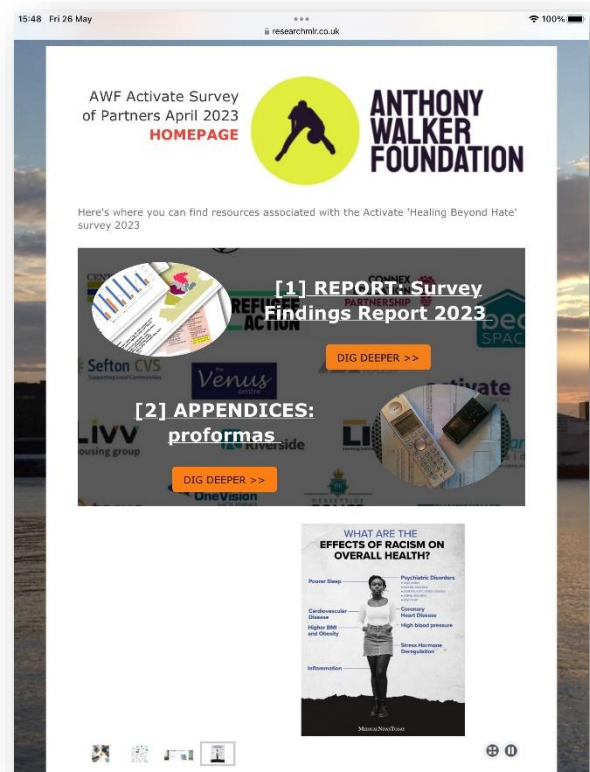
- experience of race hate crime and/or services;
- quality of support available and barriers;
- improvement ideas.

Findings & outcomes >>

87 people completed surveys, working in 39 different organisations. (see logo collage to the left). The findings include

- In the last 12 months 68 respondents (78%) had some experience of hate crime – as a victim, witness or advised someone.
- Almost 9 in 10 (86%) think the impact of race hate on mental health is often overlooked.
- Half (53%) think there are barriers to engaging with race hate support services.
- 78% would like more learning / education services; Two thirds would like more training on peer support; and over half (54%) would like more therapy options.

AWF are keen to build a wide-ranging timeline of intelligence, from a number of different service 'touch points' and perceptions, to help inform future service development. This report will be used in a summer 2023 workshop to 'stress test' service improvement ideas and co-design new services.
